







Applicant Participation in the Match

The Rank Order List Certification Deadline and the deadline for applicants to register for the Match <u>and</u> SOAP:

Wednesday, March 5 at 9:00 p.m. Eastern Time

Applicants must:

- Complete the registration process in the NRMP's Registration, Ranking, and Results[®] (R3[®]) system
- Electronically sign the Match Participation Agreement
- Pay all Match fees
- Certify your rank order list (if you intend to participate in the Match)
- Be verified as eligible to enter GME by July 1
 - U.S. medical students are verified by their medical schools
 - IMGs are verified by the ECFMG



What's New in the 2025 Main Residency Match®

New application service providers

Applicants may need to complete additional applications for SOAP

Each application service will display ALL the unfilled programs using that service for SOAP



What is SOAP?

SOAP is not another Match

Applicants apply to programs using the application service designated by the program

Programs review applications and contact applicants of interest. Programs then create preference lists of applicants in the NRMP's R3 system

Unfilled positions are offered to eligible applicants on the program's preference list in a series of four rounds

Positions offered and accepted constitute a binding commitment under the Match Participation Agreement

Applicant SOAP Eligibility

There is no separate SOAP registration

Applicants must be registered in the NRMP by March 5th to participate in the Match and SOAP

To participate in SOAP, you must register by March 5, be verified as eligible to enter GME on July 1, and be fully or partially unmatched

- How an applicant is verified depends on applicant type:
 - ✓ The ECFMG® verifies credentials of IMGs.
 - ✓ Medical Schools verify eligibility for US MD and DO Seniors and Graduates
- Either the school or the NRMP withdraws applicants whose credentials are not verified by the Rank Order List (ROL) Deadline

Communication During SOAP

SOAP-eligible applicants:

- Can access the List of Unfilled Programs in NRMP. The List will show only programs for which the applicant is eligible based on their matched status
- Are prohibited from using any means other than the application designated by the program to apply to and contact programs
- Can apply only to unfilled Match-participating programs that are participating in SOAP



Other than submitting the application, you (or your representatives) cannot contact programs until the program initiates contact

SOAP Participation Exception

Fully unmatched SOAP-eligible applicants who want to pursue interests other than clinical residency training may do so provided:

- the position sought is not affiliated with a Match- or SOAP-participating residency program;
- the position does not qualify for training credit in an ACGME-accredited residency program; and
- the applicant does not submit any applications to SOAP-participating programs during Match Week.


Unmatched or partially unmatched applicants will have access to the *List of Unfilled Programs* under the SOAP tab in **NRMP**. The *List* includes all specialties using all application services

The *List* displays the application service being used by the program

Types of Programs in the Match

Categorical	С	Training that is 3-7 years in length, begins in the PGY-1 year, and leads to specialty board certification.			
Primary Care Categorical	M	Categorical programs in primary care offered by some Internal Medicine and Pediatrics programs.			
Preliminary	P	Training that is one year in length in transitional, medicine, surgery, or other specialty programs and provides the prerequisite training for advanced programs.			
Advanced	A	Training that is 3-4 years in length in specialty programs that begin after one or more years of preliminary training. Advanced positions in the 2025 Match are PGY-2 positions that begin in 2026.			
Reserved-Physician	R	Training in specialty programs reserved for physicians with prior graduate medical education and who can enter advanced training in the year of the Match. Reserved-Physician positions in the 2025 Match are PGY-2 positions that begin in 2025.			

Applying to Unfilled Programs

SOAP-eligible applicants can view the *List of Unfilled Programs* in the NRMP's R3 system and then apply for unfilled positions for which they are eligible

Each application service will display **ALL** the unfilled programs using that service for SOAP

<u>Example</u>: An applicant who matched to an advanced Radiology program is only eligible to apply to and accept preliminary positions during SOAP. However, the applicant will be able to see all unfilled Radiology programs in ERAS.



Applicants are responsible for ensuring they apply <u>only</u> to positions for which they are eligible, as shown on the *List of Unfilled Programs*.

Applicants can apply to:

- Different specialties than they previously applied
- Unfilled program(s) to which they previously applied

Application Services

NRMP and the application services are separate organizations with separate systems

- AAMC (Association of American Medical Colleges) Electronic Residency Application Service® (ERAS®), providing application services for programs in every Match-participating specialty besides Plastic Surgery and Obstetrics and Gynecology
- Central Application, providing application services for programs in Plastic Surgery
- ResidencyCAS, providing application services for programs in Obstetrics and Gynecology



Application Services (cont.)

All application services will adhere to the same schedule, number of applications, and costs

- 45 applications to use in <u>each</u> application service for the duration of SOAP
 - Not all services may have 45 unfilled programs during SOAP
- No additional fees to apply during SOAP if the applicant applied to at least one program using that application service for the 2025 season, prior to the start of SOAP

If the applicant did not use a specific application service during the regular season:

\$99 fee to apply during SOAP

NRMP does not manage the application process for the Match or SOAP

Electronic Residency Application Service (ERAS®)

The Electronic Residency Application Service (ERAS) streamlines the residency application process for applicants, their Designated Dean's Offices, Letter of Recommendation (LoR) authors and program directors. By providing applicants the ability to build and deliver their application and supporting materials individually or as a package to programs, ERAS provides a centralized, but flexible solution to the residency application and documents distribution process.







Preparing for SOAP in MyERAS

Prior to Match Week, ERAS recommends that applicants:

Log into their AAMC account and confirm access.

• Use the *Forgot username/password* options or contact AAMC Customer Support for assistance with any login issues.

Certify and submit their MyERAS application, if not already completed this season.

 Except for the Personal Information section, the application cannot be edited once it has been certified and submitted.

Keep the Personal Information section and the **NRMP ID** updated in MyERAS.







Preparing for SOAP in MyERAS

Ahead of Match Week, ERAS recommends applicants:

Upload any new or updated supporting documents

- Medical School Transcript, Medical Student Performance Evaluation (MSPE), Letters of Recommendation (LoRs)
- USMLE and/or COMLEX-USA Transcript release
 - NBME, NBOME, and the ECFMG understand the need for expediency during this time and work to resolve these requests as quickly as possible before and throughout SOAP
- Personal statement(s) or photo







Requirements in MyERAS during SOAP

In order to apply to programs in ERAS during SOAP:

- Applicants must be SOAP-eligible (eligibility is determined by NRMP).
 - Applicants may refer to the NRMP Registration, Ranking, and Results (R3) system for their match status.
- The MyERAS Application must be Certified & Submitted
 - For those who sent an application during ERAS 2025, this step is complete.
 - For those who did not complete this as part of the regular ERAS 2025 season, go to the MyERAS application and certify and submit prior to Match week.







ERAS Fees During SOAP

If an applicant applied to at least one residency program by **7:30 a.m. ET Monday March 17, 2025**, there is no fee to participate.

Non-SOAP ERAS Application fees can be found on the ERAS for Applicants website.

If an applicant has not applied to at least one residency program before Monday, March 17 at 7:30 a.m. ET and is SOAP-eligible, they will pay the ERAS base fee of \$99 to participate.

If an applicant has not sent their USMLE or COMLEX-USA transcripts during the ERAS 2025 season, a fee of \$80 per transcript type will apply.

ERAS Applications during SOAP

- Applicants can apply to a total of 45 ERAS service-participating programs for the entire SOAP process.
 - The 45-application limit includes new and previous programs that the applicant applied to during the 2025 ERAS application season.
- Applicants cannot withdraw an application after it has been submitted. All applications will count toward the 45-application limit.
- Applicants should refer to the NRMP R3 system in between rounds for programs they are eligible for based on their match status.



Applying to Programs in MyERAS during SOAP

1. Review the NRMP's *List of Unfilled Programs*

- Navigate to MyERAS; login with your AAMC account
- 3. Search for programs in the Programs tab
- 4. Select desired training track(s) and save your programs
- 5. Select the programs you would like to apply to and choose the Apply/Preview Invoice option
- 6. Assign documents

Please refer to the NRMP's R3 system for programs you are eligible for and check that the NRMP Code matches an eligible program before applying.









^{*}Keep in mind the 45-application maximum for the entire SOAP process*

Logging into the MyERAS Application during SOAP

Supplemental Offer and Acceptance Program (SOAP) Eligibility

During Match Week (March 17-20, 2025) unmatched and partially matched applicants may participate in SOAP to try to obtain an unfilled ACGME-accredited residency position.

To participate in SOAP, applicants must be:

- Registered with NRMP for the Main Residency Match®.
- Eligible to enter graduate medical education on July 1, 2025, as verified by the applicant's medical school or the Educational Commission for Foreign Medical Graduates (ECFMG™), a member of Intealth™.
- 3. Unmatched or partially matched on Monday of Match Week.

If you are fully matched, you may not submit any applications during SOAP, as you are not eligible for any program other than the program to which you were matched. Any applications submitted by fully matched applicants or applicants who did not register for the NRMP Main Residency Match will not be refunded. For more information about participation in SOAP, please go to ERAS® Program SOAP® Information.

If you did not participate in the NRMP Match, you can apply for any open positions on Thursday, March 20th after 9pm ET.

*Confirm SOAP Participation

- I am registered for the NRMP Main Residency Match, am not already fully matched, and am participating in SOAP
- I am not participating in SOAP

*Provide NRMP ID

If you do not know your NRMP ID, you will need to log into the <u>NRMP R3 system</u> to find it. The NRMP ID allows programs to confirm applicant eligibility.




Logging into the MyERAS Application during SOAP

















Saving Programs in MyERAS during SOAP












For USMLE and COMLEX-USA transcript requests:


- NBME, NBOME, and the ECFMG understand the need for expediency during this time and work to resolve these requests as quickly as possible before and throughout SOAP.
- Tip: Applicants can keep track of Transcripts' statuses in the Additional Documents section








Assigning and Sending Documents in MyERAS during SOAP



Assigning Personal Statements in MyERAS during SOAP



- Preparing to apply through ERAS in case unmatched into OBGYN





OBGYN Match

- OBGYN is a competitive specialty
- In the last 5 years, only 3-6 categorical positions remained open in OBGYN after the main Match for SOAP
- We recommend applicants be prepared in case they do not match



Overall Timeline for SOAP for OBGYN Applicants

• Now:

 All OBGYN applicants obtain an ERAS token and login into MyERAS if they have not already done so

Pre-Match:

- For high-risk applicants (who have not dual applied already) i.e. applicants
 with low number of interviews, who do not interview well, or with red flags
 in their application
 - Fill out ERAS application
 - Upload MSPE and transcript
 - Request USMLE/COMLEX scores
 - Request LORs

- Results available at 10:00 am ET
- Matched applicants---Congratulations!!
- Unmatched and wish to SOAP
 - Can begin preparing application at 11:00 am ET
 - OBGYN spots available and wish to apply to OBGYN: ResidencyCAS
 - Wish to apply to another specialty: ERAS
 - If ERAS application already filled: regular process
 - If ERAS not filled
 - Fill out ERAS application
 - Upload MSPE and transcript
 - Request USMLE/COMLEX scores
 - Request LORs



SOAP offer rounds begin. Programs extend offers to applicants, and applicants must accept or decline within the allotted time.	Thursday, March 20, 2025
All SOAP programs close – applications will no longer be accepted.	Thursday, March 20, 2025 at 9:00 PM ET





Applying to SOAP Through ResidencyCAS

- Applying to programs similar to the regular cycle
- Only SOAP eligible programs appear
- May apply up to 45 programs
- No additional cost to applicants already in ResidencyCAS
- May upload new letters (not required)







Applying to SOAP Through ERAS

- Applying to programs similar to the regular cycle
- Cost \$99 for new applicants who do not already have ERAS applications
- May apply up to 45 programs (in addition to the programs applied to in ResidencyCAS if applicable)
- Download PDF of ResidencyCAS (preferable turn it into Word for easy copy and paste to ERAS)
- Dean's office upload MSPE and transcript
- USMLE/COMLEX through respective organizations
- LORs maybe be utilized from ResidencyCAS or new ones requested






LOR Process for EXISTING letters in ResidencyCAS

- Applicants enter LOR request in MyERAS and generate the letter request form (same as regular season)
- The applicant will then download and share or email the letter request form with their advisor who has access to Medical School Portal
- Advisors creates a LORP account (if they don't already have one)
- Advisors can upload the PDF letter that was downloaded from ResidencyCAS

Assisting Unmatched Students During SOAP Week

- Students may apply to SOAP both through ResidencyCAS and ERAS simultaneously if they wish to continue to apply to OBGYN and other specialties. Each application allows up to 45 programs independently
- NRMP Listserv will be available for help with representation from ResidencyCAS





FAQs

- Do I have to pay for USMLE/COMLEX transcripts requests in ERAS if I already paid through ResidencyCAS?
 - Applicants will be reimbursed those fees back from their respective organizations if had to pay again during SOAP week
- If I am not able to SOAP into an OBGYN program this year and I plan to apply again next year, does it matter what position I start or what prelim position I take this year?
 - Most OBGYN program directors recommend a surgery prelim year if you wish to apply to OBGYN again
- Do I need new letters of recommendations if I want to SOAP into OBGYN? Into other specialties?
 - You do not need new LORs if you plan to SOAP into OBGYN. It is recommended
 if you plan to SOAP into other specialties.













Do I need to fill out another application?

Applicants at risk of going unmatched who have applied during the regular season only through Central Application or ResidencyCAS should:

Complete an ERAS application in advance of SOAP if they intend to apply to unfilled positions in other specialties

Applicants at risk of going unmatched who have applied during the regular season only through ERAS should:

- Complete a ResidencyCAS application in advance of SOAP if they intend to apply to any unfilled positions in Ob/Gyn
- Complete a Central Application in advance of SOAP if they intend to apply to any unfilled positions in Plastic Surgery

After Applying

Tuesday, March 18 at 8:00 AM, ET

- Programs can begin reviewing applications and contacting applicants, usually via phone or email
- Applicants (or their representatives) cannot contact programs until a program contacts them in response to their application

Tuesday, March 18 and Wednesday, March 19

Applicants should be available for communication and interviews



How programs review applications, contact applicants, and conduct interviews is up to the programs




How SOAP Rounds Work










2024 PGY-1 Match Rate by Applicant Type Overall Match rate = 80.2%






Preferences of Unmatched Applicants: Available SOAP Positions




2024 SOAP: Positions Offered & Accepted by Round




2024 SOAP PositionsOffered and Accepted by Applicant and Position Type
